Become a First-Year **BEARCAT**

Each item listed is part of the application review process for students applying directly from high school to the University of Cincinnati. If a student is applying and plans to send their **test scores**, these scores must be sent directly from the testing agency. If you think you qualify for a **fee waiver**, talk to your school counselor about this process.

- The Common Application
- Application Fee (or fee waiver)
- Official High School Transcript, Unofficial High School Transcript, or SRAR Submission
- Official ACT or SAT Score (optional for most programs)
- Letter of Recommendation (optional)

For Fall 2022, students can apply to most UC programs without an ACT or SAT score. Read more about the test-optional policy at admissions.uc.edu/apply/test-optional.

DATES & DEADLINES

DECEMBER 1, 2021

Early Action Deadline (non-binding)

All required materials must be submitted by this date in order for you to be considered for merit-based scholarships, the University Honors Program, and other honors opportunities. If you meet this Early Action Deadline, you will receive your admission decision on Cincinnati Decision Day.

Cincinnati Decision Day

On Cincinnati Decision Day, which takes place in late January each year, we will share admission decisions for students who met the Early Action Deadline.

We will notify you of any awards or honors you are eligible to receive shortly after your admission decision has been released.

MARCH 1, 2022

Rolling Admission Deadline

The Common Application will remain open until March 1, and students are welcome to apply to any program that has not reached capacity. After Cincinnati Decision Day, admission decisions for students who applied after December 1 will be released on a rolling basis.

MARCH - APRIL 2022

Housing Application & Orientation Registration

In late spring, the application for campus housing and registration for Bearcats Bound Orientation will be made available to anyone who has confirmed their admission. You will have until early May to complete your campus housing application and be guaranteed a room.

MAY 1, 2022

Confirmation Deadline

Become a Transfer **BEARCAT**

University of Cincinnati undergraduate programs have varying admission requirements. At minimum, a cumulative college GPA of 2.00 is required to transfer to the Uptown Campus, though many programs are competitive and have higher requirements. Program profiles can be found at uc.edu/programs.

Some programs admit students for fall semester only and have priority deadlines.

We admit transfer students from both community and 4-year colleges and universities. Scholarships are available to qualifying transfer students from community colleges.


An associate degree is not required to transfer. However, an associate degree has several advantages, including special scholarship opportunities. Also, the Breadth of Knowledge portion of Cincinnati's General Education requirement is considered fulfilled for students with Associate of Arts, Associate of Science, or other associate degrees where articulation agreements are in place.
